Policies & Procedures

Absences & Make-Up Work:

Plagiarism:

Plagiarism is using ideas/work from others and submitting it as your own. This includes cheating on anything you turn in to me. On written assignments, this includes "copy/pasting" without any citations (page numbers, names, quotation marks/citations).

Students who plagiarize/cheat will earn a zero for the assignment and receive a discipline referral.

Electronics:

All electronic devices (including smart watches) must be off/on silent during class and placed in the designated electronics area. Please note that eBooks will not be allowed for any in-class assessment (i.e. quizzes, essays, or tests), so make sure to bring your books with you.
